

VIRTUAL REALITY COMES TO TEXADA MUSEUM

MARCH 5 and 6 10am to 2pm

The Texada Heritage Society is honoured to host the island's first public viewing of a VR (virtual reality) documentary film.

Texada is a 17-minute "impressive, poetic experience" created by Texada's own Claire Sanford along with co-director Josephine Anderson.

The captivating film explores the theme of "rocks, people and time." Scenes of Texada mixed with voices of residents flow throughout.

Viewers use headsets to immerse themselves in the head-turning 360-degree live footage, along with spectacular 3-D animation of geologic upheaval.

Claire's previous films have garnered awards (Canada Screen Awards 2024) and achieved Toronto International Film Festival's "Top 10 List" (2022) as well as nominations for "Best Cinematography in a Documentary."

The film will be available to experience at the Texada Museum on Wed March 5 and Thursday March 6 from 10am to 2pm. Everyone welcome.

Visitors will be accommodated on a FCFS basis. Several headsets will be available (sanitized before each new viewer) so the wait shouldn't be too long. Guests are invited to tour the museum while waiting. Refreshments available. A small donation is appreciated.
